

National History Day Checklist – in basically this order:

1. Talk about participating in National History Day (NHD) with your **parents**
2. Decide to work on your **own / in a group**
3. Read the [National History Day Rulebook](#)
4. Figure out your **category**: exhibit, website, presentation, and performances can either be solo or group; historical papers are solo only
5. Start **brainstorming** historical ideas, concepts, events, and people that interest you
6. Choose a **topic** that best connects to the [theme for this year](#)
7. **Narrow** down your ideas. Small ideas > big ideas
 - For example, it's better to focus on Abraham Lincoln's treatment of his Civil War generals than it is to focus on the whole Civil War
 - It's also better to focus on The Culper Ring (the group of spies that helped Washington during the AmRev) just spies
8. **Revisit** your category options – make sure whatever you choose (historical paper, website, exhibit, performance, or documentary) best complements your topic
9. Write your **THESIS** – what are you trying to prove with your topic?
10. Start **researching** sources – make sure to have at LEAST 33% books; entries with tons of websites are usually frowned upon

 - Collect **primary** sources – the words of the people who lived in that time are THE most important thing to your project
 - Collect **secondary** sources – words of other historians are crucial
 - Give credit to all your sources – not doing so is **PLAGIARISM**
 - Make sure you save all of your sources so that you can add them to your annotated bibliography
11. Begin assembling your **annotated bibliography**
 - Separate your bib into 2 categories: primary and secondary
 - Projects could have anywhere from 10-40+ sources
12. Look at [past winners' projects in your category](#) from top-to-bottom
13. Write / design an **outline** for your project
14. **Begin constructing** your project
15. Strengthen your THESIS
16. Complete your **process paper** (all groups except the historical paper)
17. **Complete** your annotated bibliography
18. Strengthen THESIS one last time
19. Complete your project for **Good Hope / Eagle View competition**
20. **Attend** Good Hope / Eagle View competition
21. Be prepared to answer judges' questions
22. Strengthen your project, bibliography, and paper for Regionals

NHD Checklist: Historical Paper

- ☐ Make sure your paper and annotated bibliography have title pages that look **like this example to the right:**
- ☐ Your **Historical Paper** MUST...
 - Be between 1,500 – 2,500 words
 - Must include **footnotes** for your research
 - Use graphs only as needed; no pictures of any kind
 - Be between **size 11-14 font**
 - Use a **standard font**, like Arial, Calibri, Times New Roman, or Verdana... no “funky” fonts
- ☐ Your **Annotated Bibliography** MUST...
 - Be **separated** into 2 categories: primary & secondary
 - Have the source cited
 - Explain **what** the source is and **how** it helped your project
 - Be easy to read (each source separated by a space)
 - Be between **size 11-16 font**
- ☐ Keep in mind that the paper division is usually less competitive, but also requires you to **finish up earlier than other categories** (typically a month prior to the regional competition).
- ☐ If you are selected to attend the Regional Competition, you must bring a copy of your paper and annotated bibliography

NHD Checklist: Exhibit

- ☐ Make sure your process paper and annotated bibliography have title pages that **look like this example to the right:**
- ☐ Your **Process Paper** MUST answer the following questions in 500 words or less:
 - How you **chose** your topic
 - How you conducted **research**
 - How you **selected** your category and created your project
 - How your project relates to **this year's NHD theme**
 - Be between size 11-16 font (and use normal fonts, please)
- ☐ Your **Annotated Bibliography** MUST...
 - Be **separated** into 2 categories: primary & secondary
 - Have the source cited
 - Explain **what** the source is and **how** it helped your project
 - Be easy to read (each source separated by a space)
 - Be between size 11-16 font (and use normal fonts, please)
- ☐ Bring **4 copies** of your process paper & annotated bib to all competitions
- ☐ Make sure your title on your exhibit is easily visible to all judges
- ☐ Exhibit size limits (does not include the table it rests on):
 - 6' (feet) height
 - 40" (inches) wide
 - 30" deep
 - If your project is circular, it's diameter must be 30" or less
- ☐ There is a **500 word limit** on the exhibit itself
 - The word limit includes titles, subtitles, and student-written explanations
 - You should have a good amount of primary sources, quotes, and pictures, as they do not count towards your word limit
- ☐ You can include other things in front of your exhibit (like things to touch, multimedia, and so on) to draw the judges' eye to it; however, the main portion of the exhibit will be how you present your information

- ☐ Make sure your process paper and annotated bibliography have title pages that **look like this example to the right:**

- ☐ Make sure you keep your performance under the **10 minute time limit**; I recommend being close to 8 minutes
- ☐ You will be granted 5 minutes to **set-up** your documentary and 5 minutes to **pack up**
- ☐ You should begin your performance by **introducing the performers and the title of your performance ONLY**
- ☐ You may use **multimedia** devices (computer, audio, slideshows) to supplement your performance
- ☐ You may use **costumes**, but judges recommend being simple with it
- ☐ Try not to have any downtime in the performance by changing costumes

NHD Checklist: Documentary

- ☐ Make sure your process paper and annotated bibliography have title pages that **look like this example to the right:**
- ☐ Your **Process Paper** MUST answer the following questions in 500 words or less:
 - How you **chose** your topic
 - How you conducted **research**
 - How you **selected** your category and created your project
 - How your project relates to **this year's NHD theme**
 - Be between size 11-16 font (and use normal fonts, please)
- ☐ Your **Annotated Bibliography** MUST...
 - Be **separated** into 2 categories: primary & secondary
 - Have the source cited
 - Explain **what** the source is and **how** it helped your project
 - Be easy to read (each source separated by a space)
 - Be between size 11-16 font (and use normal fonts, please)
- ☐ Bring **4 copies** of your process paper & annotated bib to all competitions
- ☐ Make sure you keep your documentary under the **10 minute time limit**; I recommend being close to 8 minutes
- ☐ You will be granted 5 minutes to **set-up** your documentary and 5 minutes to **pack up**
- ☐ You should begin your performance by **introducing the performers and the title of your documentary ONLY**
- ☐ Everything in the documentary must be **student-produced** and original only to your group, including voice over, dramatization, and narration.
- ☐ At the end of your production, you should have a **credits screen**; that is included in your 10 minute limit
- ☐ Stand-alone displays & posters are **prohibited**
