Graduation Requirements - philosophy

"K to Capstone" – from Kindergarten until the student meets the State Graduation Requirements (Capstone) - maintain the excellence for which CV is known

Maintain the 23 credit graduation requirement but provide more student choice in attaining these credits

Move from the Industrialized "one mold fits all" to personalizing a student's education based on individual interests and career pathways

Embrace forward thinking and continual improvement through providing traditional and non-traditional opportunities for 11th and 12th graders

Promote programs and opportunities that allow students to connect with the community while gaining practical experiences.

New Graduation Requirements Starting with class of 2020

- 23 credits to graduate 14 credits in "Core Course"
- Seniors need to complete all "core courses" and carry a minimum of 3 credits during senior year
- 4 credits required in English all others 3 credits and choice of 4th credits
- Health & PE 1.5 credits (reduced from 2 credits for most students 3 years)
- Student may graduate once completed 23 credits (may graduate before end of senior year)
- Once completing 28 credits Diploma granted unless in a specialized program

New Graduation Requirements Starting with class of 2021

- Same Graduation requirements as 2020 but an addition:
- High School courses successfully completed (85% or higher) while a student is in middle school – will count towards the 23 credits needed for graduation.
- Presently these courses are: Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, Spanish/French/German I and Spanish/French/German II.


Highlights from the Program of Study to support these Graduation Changes

- Provide increasing HACC, Shippensburg University and College in the High School Dual Credit courses that allow students to earn HS/College credits at a reduced cost
- Adding HACC programs in Fire Training and Emergency Medical Responders that connect students with Local Fire/EMS companies and can lead to industry certificates
- Continue to offer traditional, blended and online learning opportunities
- Provide Semester III (summer) opportunities for students to earn credits which allows flexibility and opportunities.

Highlights from the Program of Study to support these Graduation Changes

- Provide Internships in many career paths: Business, Conservation, Engineering, Healthcare, Logistics, Science and Technology
- Provide Workplace experiences through Cumberland-Perry Vo-Tech, CV's Agriculture Technical Program and Cooperative Education opportunities in the community
- Customized schedules for 11th/12th graders late arrivals/early dismissals, reduced credit requirements in 12th grade, ability to take less "required" courses and more preferred courses.
