That's why the Eagle Foundation has invested significant dollars in both the *learning grants program and summer enrichment camps* for more than a decade. Both programs provide opportunities to a large number of students in most grades, spanning the Cumberland Valley's tenbuilding campus.

In order to assist the Eagle Foundation in providing larger investments in these initiatives, we invite you to join us as a sponsor of a <u>summer camp</u> or classroom <u>learning grant</u>.

The learning grants committee, initiated in 2002, has approved more than \$260,054 in funds for CV teachers, advisors and coaches to carry out innovative programs that otherwise would not have been possible. The basis for the program was to provide professional staff with funding to purchase materials and equipment to implement inventive teaching ideas.

An average grant is approximately \$500, but may be higher if the project warrants the funds by benefitting large numbers of students. Enclosed is a sampling of recently awarded grants.

Over the years, the Foundation's camp schedule has included a variety of subject areas including art, science, math, creative writing as well as chess and debate camp. These camps target students ranging in grades one through twelve. In 2017, the Foundation hosted 40 camps, registering 861 students. Although not finalized yet, the Foundation expects to post the 2018 camp schedule in February also including about 40 camps. The Foundation keeps camp registration fees low, typically just \$55 per camp, by subsidizing expenses from its general fund.
