REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

Please review this packet for details on camp offerings. Registrations will be accepted online beginning <u>April 6th at 6 a.m.</u> for students living in the Cumberland Valley School District (you will be asked to enter the student ID when registering). Beginning on April 13th, students living outside the CV District can register for camps with availability.

A \$10.00 CANCELLATION FEE per camp will be charged for ALL camps that are cancelled, regardless of the cancellation date.

Programs are being offered with age appropriate activities for children who will be enrolled in grades 1-12 during the 2021-2022 school year.

Registration is by grade <u>entering as of August 2021</u>.

This pamphlet describes the hands-on enrichment camps. In addition, the Foundation will fund programs like the Reading and Math Booster Program and Buddy Program that are being offered by invitation for students with specific needs.

Class cost for *most* camps: \$65.00 per class

- * Full Day Camp is \$140.00 per child
- * Junior Theater Camp is \$75.00 per child
- * Bricks4Kidz Camps & Camp Girls on the Run are \$125.00 per child
- * Musical Theater Camp is \$205.00 per child
- * Full STEAM Ahead is \$145.00 per child

- **Online registration fees** will be charged by Active.com in addition to the class cost.
- Remember to keep a record of all classes for which you have registered your children. (Confirmations will be sent by email only.)
- ***** There is a **\$10** administrative fee for each cancelled camp regardless of the cancellation date.
- **Refunds cannot be granted for cancellations** within (4) weeks of the camp starting date.
- All camps have a minimum and maximum number of participants. Space is reserved on a firstcome, first-served basis. Register early for the best camp selection. Wait lists are established after camps have been filled.
- Camp Cancellation Policy: All participants voluntarily withdrawing from a camp program must present their request via email. No refund will be given to participants voluntarily cancelling less than four weeks prior to the start of the camp. If an entire camp program is cancelled due to COVID-19 restrictions, a full refund will be issued.

If camp is cancelled after one day, 75% registration fee returned If camp is cancelled after two days, 50% of registration fee returned If camp is cancelled after three days, 25% of registration fee returned

- Wait lists will be managed through group emails. All students on the given wait list will be sent an email to notify the group of any cancellations. Openings will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis determined by the email response dates/times.
- Students who are registered for paired camps will have a supervised one-hour lunch break including a 30-minute outdoor recess. Students will need to bring a packed lunch.
- The Foundation reserves the right to cancel a camp if the number of participants is not reached or for any other logistical reason. If the Foundation cancels a camp, the registration fees will be refunded.
- Pre-registration for all camps is required and should be done at least one week prior to the camp start date.
- Scholarships are available to those who can demonstrate financial need. Please forward an email to <u>bgabrielson@cvschools.org</u> explaining your need and assistance you are currently receiving. Indicate "Scholarship Request" as the subject. For best camp selections, camp scholarship requests should be turned in ASAP.
- Full Day camps will have camp related work/free time activities at the beginning and end of each day. Students should bring a packed lunch. An outside recess will also be included in the break time.
- Locations are subject to change.
- Students should not be dropped off earlier than 5 minutes prior to the camp starting time and must be picked up within 5 minutes after the camp concludes. Earlier drop-offs or later pick-ups will not be allowed.

- Understand that summer building/camp staff is very limited. A nurse will not be in the building. Please list any situation you believe may require special attention. Attempts will be made to address these in advance and severe cases may need to reconsider participation.

- Attendees will be required to wear a mask at all times.
- Frequent hand-washing and hand sanitation will be enforced.
- Students will maintain social distancing during the majority of camp time.
- Classrooms and areas used will be cleaned at the conclusion of activities each day.
- If a student or staff member is present and begins to exhibit symptoms of any contagious illness the student or staff member will be immediately isolated, and a parent/guardian will be called to pick their student up.
- In the event that a participating student does test positive for Covid-19 and the Eagle Foundation is made aware, we will inform all members of the program.

This is a full day camp which is driven by the idea of STEAM, Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math, activities. Fun and Learning go hand in hand with topics and projects that are guided by the STEAM acronym. Half of the day students will be engaged in fun STEAM activities and the other half will be concentrating on the Art part of STEAM. The projects and learning from each camp will be coordinated to overlap and relate to each other. For instance, (1) what makes undersea animals like jelly fish have a luminescent chemical and then creating an artwork while using products containing luminescent qualities or (2) discovering architecture from a math and science perspective while also creating a draft of your very own dream house. Mr. Miller, 2016 PA National History Day Teacher of the Year, will lead the group. The National History Day project is part of the 8th grade enriched social studies class program. While students do not need to be in this class to participate in the NHD project, it can benefit those who will have the class.
