Pneumonia

- A serious lung condition. Can be a complication of other illnesses and can occur throughout the year.
- Cause: Most commonly respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), influenza virus and some bacteria. Physical and chemical irritants may also cause pneumonia.
- Symptoms: Rapid breathing and pain, usually fever and cough. May have runny nose, milder cough and fever several days before getting pneumonia.
- Incubation: Depends on the germ causing the infection. It is spread person to person by touching the secretions from the nose and mouth of the infected person.
- Can child come to school: The child should remain at home until the fever is gone And he/she is well enough to participate in routine activities.
- Prevention/Control: Wash hand thoroughly with soap and warm running water after touching the secretions from the mouth and nose. Cover nose and mouth with a tissue when coughing and sneezing or cough/sneeze into sleeve.

 Dispose of used tissues.
- Treatment: There is no specific treatment for most viruses. Antibiotics may be Prescribed is a bacterial infection is suspected or diagnosed.
