REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS

Please review this packet for details on camp offerings. **For additional information on camps and to view camp openings, visit www.cvschools.org/efcamps**

Registrations will be accepted online beginning **March 7th at 6 a.m.** for students living in the Cumberland Valley School District (CVSD students will be asked to enter the student ID when registering). Beginning on March 14th, students living outside of the CV District can register for camps with availability.

\$15.00 CANCELLATION FEE per camp will be charged for **ALL** student cancellations, regardless of the cancellation date.

Registration is by grade entering as of August 2023. Programs are being offered with age appropriate activities for children who will be enrolled in grades 1-12 during the 2023-2024 school year.

Include the name of the student(s), their school building and grade level, your full name and assistance you are currently receiving. *For best camp selections, camp scholarship requests should be turned in ASAP.*
- **Online registration fees will be charged by Active.com in addition to the class cost. You are not required to sign up for the optional "Active Advantage" plan. This is a program administered through Active and the Eagle Foundation has no access to this account information.**
- **Remember to keep a record of all classes for which you have registered your children. (Confirmations will be sent by email only.)**

Cancellations/Wait list

- **There is a \$15 administrative fee for all student cancellations, regardless of the cancellation date.**
- **Camp Cancellation Policy:** All participants voluntarily withdrawing from a camp program must present their request via email. **No refund** will be given to participants voluntarily canceling **less than four weeks prior to the start of the camp.**
- All camps have a minimum and maximum number of participants. Space is reserved on a first come, first-served basis. Register early for the best camp selection. Wait lists are established after camps have been filled.
- The Foundation reserves the right to cancel a camp if the number of participants is not reached or for any other logistical reason. If the Foundation cancels a camp, the registration fees will be refunded.
- **Wait lists will be managed through group emails. All students on the given wait list will be sent an email to notify the group of any cancellations. Openings will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis determined by the email response dates/times.**

Policies

- Pre-registration for all camps is required and should be done at least one week prior to the camp start date. All registrations are to be completed online.
- Camp locations are subject to change.
- **Students should not be dropped off earlier than 5 minutes prior to the camp starting time and must be picked up within 5 minutes after the camp concludes. Earlier drop-offs or later pick-ups will not be allowed. A \$50 late fee per child per incident will be assessed for a late pick-up.** Promptness is mandatory. Pick-ups must be done within five minutes of the completion time of each camp. Failure to pick up your student in a timely manner could result in dismissal from the camp with no refund issued. The Eagle Foundation summer camps program is an enrichment program and not a daycare.
- Students who are registered for paired camps will have a supervised one-hour lunch break including a 30-minute outdoor recess. Students will need to bring a packed lunch.
- Full Day camps will have camp-related work/free time activities at the beginning and end of each day. Students will need to bring a packed lunch. An outside recess will also be included in the break time.
- Summer building/camp staff is very limited. A nurse will not be in the building. Please list any situation you believe may require special attention. Attempts will be made to address these in advance and severe cases may need to reconsider participation.
- Classrooms and areas used will be cleaned at the conclusion of activities each day.
- If a student or staff member is present and begins to exhibit symptoms of any contagious illness, the student or staff member will be immediately isolated and a parent/guardian will be called to pick their student up.
- The Eagle Foundation will follow all Covid-19 guidelines in accordance with the Cumberland Valley School District guidelines during the time of the camp.

Art Adventures

The Cumberland Valley Eagle Foundation is excited to announce their production of The Lion King JR as their fourth annual musical summer camp. Students who will have completed third grade through eighth grade in the 22-23 school year are invited to attend as we bring the story to life on stage complete with costumes, choreography, sets, lighting, and music! The Lion King JR adapts the well known production of The Lion King for students while maintaining the integrity of the production and the well known characters and songs from the musical. The musical tells the story of Simba as he grows up in the Pridelands and interacts with his uncle Scar, his friend Nala, his father Mufasa, Timon and Pumbaa, wildebeest, hyenas, and the other animals in the savannah.

The camp begins on July 24, with rehearsals Monday through Friday, from 8:30am - 4:30pm. Rehearsal dates are as follows: 7/24, 7/25, 7/26, 7/27, 7/28, 7/31, 8/1, 8/2, 8/3, 8/4. Please ensure that students are able to attend all rehearsals in order to have a successful show. Students will need to pack and bring lunch each day. Our musical camp is a fun-filled, busy, and intense two weeks of rehearsal. In addition to attending and being engaged in rehearsal every day, students should be prepared to work on their parts outside of rehearsal, and to work on songs, dialogue, and choreography before the camp starts. All students need to attend all rehearsals, meetings, and performances. All rehearsals and performances will be held at Mountain View Middle Middle School. We will have 2 performances on August 4th at 3:00pm and 6:30pm. Please note that on Friday August 4 students will stay from 8:30am through the end of the second performance (most likely around 7:30pm). Dinner will be provided for students on this day.

During camp, students will focus on honing various theatrical skills including musical, dramatic, movement, artistic, and technical skills. Students will work on vocal technique, solo and group choreography and movement, blocking and staging, scenework, developing characters, and making choices. Students will be engaged in the design process and have opportunities to paint, assemble costumes, and learn about the various technical elements that go into show design such as lighting, sound, and set design. Additionally, students will improve their dramatic skills through theatre games and improvisation activities.

While major costume pieces will be provided, students will be responsible for bringing base layers and all black shoes. More information about base layers will be provided at the family meeting.

There will be a mandatory student and parent meeting on June 5th at 6:00pm at Mountain View Middle Middle School Performing Arts Center. Information and scripts/music will be handed out at this time.

As part of each student's theatre education, they will all participate in auditions. Auditions will be on May 24 or May 25 starting at 6pm at Mountain View Middle Middle School. Students will audition in groups of 4-5 students. Families will be able to sign up for an audition via an emailed link beginning on May 15. In order to receive this important information, please make sure your email address is correct when signing up for the camp.

The Local History of the Civil War**Grades: 6-12**

People are often unaware of the rich history of Cumberland County in the Civil War - from the Confederate capture of Mechanicsburg to the Sporting Hill Elementary engagement to the cannon duel between Confederates at Peace Church and Union soldiers near 32nd Street and Market Street. This camp will address the larger view of Cumberland County and the Civil War and the Confederacy's invasion into Pennsylvania well north of Gettysburg. Chambersburg, Carlisle, and Mechanicsburg and other towns were all captured by the Confederates. A take-home map will be provided for attendees to encourage family visits to nearby Civil War sites and to the Civil War Museum in Harrisburg.

The Science of Sound**Grades: 2-5**

There are so many ways that we use science to understand sound, instruments, and music. In our camp, we will learn how instruments make sound, use this knowledge to make our own instruments, and join together in playing our instruments. We will use found sounds and recycled materials to make instruments for our own musical ensembles.
